High Five

HIGH FIVE is Canada's quality standard for children's recreation and sport. As a Registered Organization we are committed to ensuring quality programs based on the 5 Principles of Healthy Child Development (A Caring Adult, Friends, Play, Mastery & Participation) and the 3 Design Guidelines (Developmentally Appropriate, Safe & Welcoming Diversity and Uniqueness). Quality assurance is maintained through program evaluations using the national standard of Quest 2 as well as staff and volunteer training.

Choice Theory

We aim to provide children with the necessary tools to self regulate and problem solve by role modeling, teaching and asking reflective questions. It is our hope to help children to help themselves with the support and guidance of our caring adults.

Opportunities for Swimming

Skyline Acres: Each week the Skyline Facility will visit Queen Square for swimming on Fridays as an additional outing. Also, during the week, they will visit the neighbourhood wading pool on hot days or play water games when they need to cool down.

Devon: Children at the Devon facility will also swim regularly at the pool attached to the building. They will also make trips to their wading pool and play water games as well.

Fees and Special Rates

Regular Weekly Rate: \$130 for the 1st child - \$125 for each additional child. For the short weeks due to the holiday in July and August, the weekly fee those weeks will be \$120 a week. Register for 10 weeks and receive the tenth week for free.

Subsidization and special rates are always available.
